Items needing attention from home:

Home/School Communication binder- keeps all school notes and papers together

Why is it important to have? This notebook helps students to establish good organizational skills that can carry on throughout the rest of their school career.

- Check the binder pockets for important parent handouts and information
- Daily planner allows student to keep track of assignments and keeps us in touch with each other. *Please sign it daily*.
- Check the "Information" section of the binder for important information that your child will need for the whole year.

Child's responsibility:

- Keep all work together in binder
- Copy all assignments into daily planner
- Read every night for at least 20 minutes
- Complete all homework and assignments on time
- Make up missed work
- On a nightly basis: review anything you are confused about
- On a weekly basis: study for all upcoming tests/quizzes

Parent's responsibility

- Sign the planner nightly.
- Make sure assignments are completed and returned to school on their due date in your child's binder
- Monitor daily reading and check that your child is completing the homework packet correctly and completely
- Talk to your child about school and what they are learning;
 help them study for upcoming tests/quizzes
- Notify school in writing about changes in transportation or absence

Morning Routines

- Students are escorted to class from the cafeteria at 8:30
- Students start doing their Morning Work immediately (Daily Language and Math problems)
- Tardy Bell 8:45 and Morning Announcements
- Collect any notes/letters from parents; take attendance and lunch count
- Review Morning Work and begin our day.

Math

- IReady and Go Math
 - Students reinforce what they learned last year and practice new concepts in a variety of ways, including partner work and the use of manipulatives to problem solve.
 - Incorporate technology in the lesson to make the lessons exciting!
 - Solid developmental approach (less topics but we teach to mastery)
 - Read, Solve, and Explain word problems in all concept areas.
 - Must have automaticity with Multiplication facts!

Reading/Language Arts

- Reading series IReady and Journeys
- Six units (All curriculum areas are integrated into our reading.)
- Each day's lesson includes: Phonics, Reading and Responding, and Language Arts
- Workshop/Intervention/Enrichment are also built into our schedule to ensure all students are successful
- Weekly tests, class work, homework, quizzes, essays, and spelling tests are included in your child's grades for Reading/Language Arts
- Student edition is online! passwords and user id information was sent home

Reading: How Can You Help?

- •Ask your child these questions (who, what, when, where, how? and WHY?)
- •Help make real life connections to what they are reading
- •Role model read to them/have them read to you
- •Fluency: timed reading passages
- •Vocabulary development Conversations!
- •Put the closed caption on the TV and mute it.... really.

Behavior System:

I believe in positive reinforcement and helping the students realize there are consequences for their choices (both good and bad).

Positive Consequences for good choices:


- Students receive positive verbal feedback on a regular basis in the classroom; notes are sent home letting parents know of good behavior
- Move their color up to blue (S+) and purple (S++)
- Purple card is bunched for purple when the card is full s/he gets to go to the folder and pick a reward
- One well behaved student becomes "Student of the Week"
- Homework Club (breakfast) for those children who didn't miss "any" homework during the month

Negative Consequences for poor choices:

- Students are reminded of the rules and given a verbal warning
- Students change their color two spots and get a brief note home in planner
- 6 S- will result in an N on the report card and will not be eligible for honor roll or principals honor roll.

Major offenses will be referred to our Dean, Mrs. Elliott, and other administration including the principal, Ms. Carlock.
